## **Data protection information**

The German Sport University Cologne (hereinafter referred to as *GSU*) collects personal data from the participants of the Summer School Research "Research Methods in Sports Science for Interdisciplinary Approaches", Sun 20<sup>th</sup> – Sat 26<sup>th</sup> of August, 2023, for the purpose of registration for this event. The protection of personal data is a central concern for the GSU. Consequently, we feel committed to the legal requirements, in particular to the General Data Protection Regulation of the European Union (hereinafter referred to as *GDPR*), the Data Protection Act of the German federal state of North Rhine-Westphalia and the Universities Act of North Rhine-Westphalia.

With these data protection provisions, we inform you according to Art. 13 and 14 GDPR on the handling of your personal data and your rights according to GDPR.

#### 4. Purpose and legal basis of the data processing

For the purpose of registration for the Summer School Research "Research Methods in Sports Science for Interdisciplinary Approaches", Sun 20th – Sat 26th of August, 2023, the GSU collects the following personal data from the participants: surname, first name, gender, date of birth, postal and e-mail address, academic degrees, current affiliation, study/research disciplines, choice of workshops, need for accommodation, information on special diet or other special needs.

The legal basis to process these data is Art. 6 (1), sentence 1a) GDPR.

#### 5. To whom can your data be transferred to?

Your personal data is not disclosed to third parties without your explicit consent if this is not necessary. The transmission to state institutions and authorities that are entitled to obtain such information is carried out only within the statutory disclosure requirements or if we are obliged to provide information by a court decision. Provided that we rely on contractually affiliated third-party companies and external service providers for the purpose of fulfilment, these have been carefully selected and commissioned by us, are bound by our instructions, and are regularly monitored.

## 6. How long will your data be stored?

Your data are conserved until 31<sup>st</sup> of December, 2023. After expiry of the conservation period your data will be deleted.

#### 7. Your rights as data owner

Due to the collection and processing of your personal data, you have the following rights vis-àvis the GSU:

- the right of information about your personal data according to Art. 15 GDPR;
- the right of correction of your personal data according to Art. 16 GDPR *or* of deletion of your personal data according to Art. 17 GDPR;
- the right of restriction of processing your personal data according to Art. 18 GDPR;
- the right of data portability of your personal data according to Art. 20 GDPR.

As far as data processing is done on the basis of consent (see Art. 6 (1), sentence 1a) GDPR), you also have the right to withdraw your consent at any time according to Art. 7 (3) GDPR without affecting the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until withdrawal. In this case you may object to the data processing at the above address (see no. 1).

If your data is processed for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the GSU (see Art. 6 (1), sentence 1e) GDPR), you may object to this processing at any time at the above address (see no. 1) in accordance with Art. 21 GDPR, provided that grounds arise from your particular situation which conflict with this data processing. The data processing is then terminated unless GSU can prove compelling legitimate reasons for processing which outweigh your interests, rights and freedoms, or if the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

Insofar as you are of the opinion that your rights listed above have been violated within the meaning of the applicable data protection legislation, you also have the right to complain to the competent supervisory authority in accordance with Art. 77 GDPR. For this purpose, please contact the:
