Introduction:


We started the workshop with a short introduction: Jürgen Mittag welcomed the guests and Ninja Putzmann gave an overview about the NSGO project: the project partners, objectives, data collection and general results of the German sport federations in comparison to high-scoring federations in Europe.



Presentation of the results:

The presentation of the results was based on a poster gallery. For each federation we prepared a poster with basic information, the total score as well as coloured dashboards and scores for transparency, democracy, accountability and societal responsibility. Furthermore, we displayed strengths and weaknesses for each federation and dimension.

The inspection of the poster gallery started with Germany's national umbrella organisation, the DOSB, and selected several indicators which highlighted particularities of the DOSB. Afterwards, we opened the presentation wit a walk between the posters. The participants of the federations got detailed information about the results and had the opportunity to comment and explain the results from their perspective in a confidential atmosphere.









Discussion of the results:

Afer the individual talks in front of the posters, we decided to have an open discussion to share individual experiences with regard to good governance. For each dimension we considered which actions or steps might prove feasible and useful to improve good governance, and which aspects might be rather obstructive and difficult to implement. Thanks to an intense discussion we collected a lot of experiences as well as wishes and restrictions which we pinned up as results according to the four dimensions.







Follow-up and outlook:

Overall, the meeting was fruitful and interesting. We received a constructive feedback from the attendees. Through individual and open discussions we achieved a positive attitude concerning the topic of good governance. As a next step we will arrange interviews with the federations to explore and assess further particularities and explain similarities as well as differences between the national sport federations in Germany.
