Junior Professor in motor control in sports (male/female/diverse)

Applications are invited for a position as Junior Professor (German W1 level) in motor control in sports for a fixed-term contract of 3 years. An extension for an additional 3 years is possible subject to the candidate's performance evaluation. The intended start is as soon as possible.

GSU seeks applicants with internationally recognized expertise in motor control in sports.

Applicants must document:

- a record of original research in the context of the professorship at a high international level
- positive teacher/course evaluations in the context of the professorship.

Applicants are expected to document:

- research in the field of motor control and/or motor learning
- a recognizable transfer of scientific findings into sports practice
- experience in the acquisition of third-party funds

Applicants should:

- be willing and able to collaborate with colleagues from other disciplines
- have advanced English language teaching skills
- have spent time at academic institutions abroad.

The willingness to participate in all Bachelor, Master and Teacher Training courses at GSU is expected.

Prerequisites of employment according to § 36 of the Higher Education Act NRW are:

- a university degree
- a Ph.D. or equivalent
- appropriate pedagogical/educational skills

The position includes a teaching load of 4 academic hours (45 mins) per week for the first phase (F1) and 5 academic hours per week (F1) in the second phase.

For international applicants, initial adequate German language skills and the ability to offer classes taught in German language within six semesters are expected.

The German Sport University Cologne strives to increase the proportion of female staff and expressly encourages qualified female applications. Women will be considered preferentially in accordance with the State Equality Act.



Applications from persons with severe disabilities or equivalent status are welcome. They will be given preferential treatment within the framework of the statutory provisions.
