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

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# A book on disability sport?

  - But, interconnectedness with Paralympic Sports
- Cross-national (European) comparison




# Why a book?

Self reported long standing limitations in usual activities due to health problems, population16 years and older, international comparison (percentage, 2017)

- <u>Considerable share population</u> in European countries experiences limitations in daily activities due to health problems.
- Netherlands: 12% population one or more severe or moderate disabilities (physical, hearing, visual) (source: CBS GE)
- 1% population has an intellectual disability (Woittiez et al, 2014)

# Why a book?

- 2) Right to participate (UN rights) >> BUT
- 3) Participation in sport lags far behind >> AND
- 4) Literature/research on disability sport is scarce:
  - Lack of data on sport participation data. Statistical evidence.
  - Disability sport policy, governance and provision is under researched area.
  - Need for new book?

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# Aim of the book

- Provide information and data regarding:
  - How national and regional/local (sports)policies contribute to stimulation of sport participation and improvement of provision of sport (POLIS);
  - Way in which sport for people with disabilities is governed, structured and organised (MEASURE/POLIS);
  - Extent to which and how people with disabilities participate in sport (MEASURE);
  - Methods/challenges data collection.
- Fill gap in literature
- Gain more understanding/awareness
- Provoke interest and further research

## **Content theoretical framework**

- Images on disability (sport) through time
  - (disability models: medical, social, integration, human rights model; Brittain, 2004; Wuyts, 2010; Smith & Bundan, 2018)
- Policy (systems/law) on disability sport in European perspective (human rights, EU, UN)
- Explaining disability: definitions (International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health,; OECD indicator WHO,
  - Physical, Hearing, Visual & Intellectual (and/or other?)
- Share of population with disabilities (European data)
- Model(s) to explain barriers and facilitators (optional)
- Methodological challenges data collection on sport participation






